## Slow Worm





Slow Worms are a legless lizard often mistaken for snakes

- Unlike snakes they can blink, and have a flat forked tongue
- Like a lot of lizards they can lose their tails if scared, but the tail does eventually grow back
- Wide spread throughout Britain, but are absent from Ireland
- Males: usually grey or brown in colour. May have bright blue spots. Females: usually golden brown on top and darker on sides and belly. Often have a dark stripe running along

back. **Juveniles:** black or dark brown belly. Gold, silver or copper sides.
